

Five-year BA/MA Program in Public Policy

The Johns Hopkins Institute for Policy Studies and School of Arts and Sciences are pleased to announce the BA/MA program in Public Policy. The regular Master's degree program in Public Policy (MPP) requires two years of study beyond the Bachelor's degree. Hopkins undergraduates accepted into the BA/MA program from majors such as economics, political science, sociology, or social and behavioral sciences will complete their BA in the normal four years while beginning study for the MA in Public Policy no later than the fall of their senior year. They will complete the Master's degree requirements in the fifth year.

The MPP is a two-year multidisciplinary degree that equips students with the analytical skills required to understand public problems and develop policy responses. The program is small by design, affording students extensive opportunities to interact with faculty in classes, seminars, research and teaching assistantships, student thesis research, and academic and career advice. The MPP Program also offers: (i) training in policy analysis, program evaluation and implementation, (ii) location within a University-based research institute, which provides opportunities to work on policy research and technical assistance projects, (iii) a curriculum combining strong analytic courses and a focus on the evolving concept of citizenship and the moral dimensions of policy choice, and (iv) preparation for careers in the public, nonprofit and private sectors.

Each MPP student takes a core of nine required courses. In addition s/he elects an area of concentration such as environmental policy, health policy, international affairs, social welfare policy, the nonprofit sector, and urban and regional development. In the area of concentration, the student does an internship (typically in the summer between the years of study), takes several elective courses, and has the opportunity to produce a Master's thesis.

Applications are due February 1 for admission the following September. Applicants for the BA/MA program must submit:

- a completed application form and personal statement
- two letters of recommendation, including at least one from a faculty member in the student's baccalaureate department (the latter not only making the recommendation, but acknowledging that the student can fulfill both BA and MA requirements on schedule); and
- a resume stressing the applicant's internships, extracurricular activities, and work experience.

An interview following receipt of the application is also required. The Graduate Record Examination (GRE), normally required for Public Policy applicants, is not required of BA/MA applicants.
